What is the Huntington's Disease Society of America?

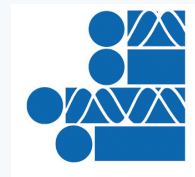
The Huntington's Disease Society of America [HDSA] is a national non-profit voluntary health agency. The mission of HDSA is three-fold:
